Good morning,

I just wanted to raise a concern that not all online platforms that pose a risk to childrens online privacy appear to be captured by the proposed code.

There are games and apps, including those marketed as being educational, which do not allow messaging between players and do not allow sharing of media between users, however still save children information, ask for their personal details, and alike. This includes commonly used platforms such as Mathletics and Microsoft's Reading Progress (the latter requires children to video record themselves reading aloud at home and sends it to the teacher).

My understanding of the definitions around social media used in this code won't capture these platforms which do still require the protections that the code otherwise provides.

I'm very happy to discuss this further or provide further information, either in my role as a paediatric clinical psychologist or as a mum of two primary school aged children.
